

CORRECT USE OF A METERED-DOSE INHALER

Finding out how much Medicine is in the Canister

- 1. It is important to make sure that the canister holds enough medicine.
- 2. If the canister has been used often, it might be empty. (Check the label to see how many inhalations should be in each canister.)
- 3. To find out how much medicine is left in the canister, put the canister (without the mouthpiece) in a container of water. If the canister sinks to the bottom, it is full. If the canister floats sideways on the surface, it is empty.

Using the Inhaler

- 1. Remove the cap and hold the inhaler upright.
- 2. Shake the inhaler
- 3. Tilt your head back slightly and breathe out
- 4. Hold the inhaler between your thumb and pointer finger.
- 5. Press down on the inhaler to release the medicine as you start to breathe in slowly.
- 6. Breathe in slowly for three to five seconds.
- 7. Hold your breath for 10 seconds to allow medicine to go deeply into your lungs.
- 8. Repeat puffs as directed. Wait one minute between puffs to allow the second puff to get into the lungs better.

NOTE: Inhaled dry powder capsules are used differently. To use a dry powder inhaler, close your mouth tightly around the mouthpiece of the inhaler and breathe in quickly.
